Shabbat service. We searched out the closest synagogue and found one in Appleton - the only one in Appleton. We arrived on time, but the door to the synagogue was locked. We stood outside with a few members and waited for someone to show up with the key. Déjà Vue.

It is a conservative synagogue that had been around for a while, and they were glad we were there because we made the minyan. Everyone was so warm and welcoming. Sound familiar yet? They had a Lay Leader who was very knowledgeable and had very interesting little stories. Hmm...The ages ranged from the elders to the newly wed and pregnant to a little girl who entertained us from in front of the bima with an interpretive dance of the Torah portion. After services, we were invited for *Kiddush*, kichel, herring and conversation. I said to myself, this must be what strangers to SJC feel like the first time they joins us. We felt at home.

Then on Sunday, we drove to Oshkosh where I grew up and we wanted to find the synagogue of my past. We found the address, again the only synagogue in town, and with the help of our mighty GPS, we were there. It was just as I remembered. I was home again. I got out of the car and walked up the stairs at the front entrance. I just had to touch the door, I placed my open palm on the front of the large wooden doors knowing that I was placing my hand where I knew my mother and my father has once placed theirs, and I was

able to hold their hand again. I was home again. Here is where my Jewish venture began, and here I was so many years later. The memories flew across my eyes. Even though the doors were locked, I saw inside the synagogue, and I was sitting in the wooden pews with my family. I was downstairs in the school with the Rabbi. I was home again

When we came back to Rehoboth, I sent a donation and a note to the synagogue in Appleton and the synagogue in Oshkosh. I got a lovely thank you note from the treasure of the synagogue in Appleton, but I received an amazing e-mail from the President of the congregation in Oshkosh. He was so moved by my letter, he is going to publish it in their next newsletter. He also told me, that the next time we visit, if I let him know we are coming, he will give us a personal tour of the synagogue. They had just completed a minor renovation of their kitchen and they just received a nice donation for a handicap lift! Wow, sound familiar? I told him about our renovations and our lift and asked him to please put me on the mailing list for their newsletter, and I would send him ours. I did go home and I came back home, too.

So, you can go home again. When I was there, it was as if I had never left. I had that same feeling inside, the only difference was I had my husband with me and not my parents. Then, my husband brought me back to Rehoboth, back home again. Home is where your heart is, home is where your memories are made, home is where you love and are loved.

## **Mussar Group Organizational Meeting February 11**

A group that will study and engage in the spiritual practices of *Mussar* is forming within the SJC community. *Mussar* is a Hebrew word which means correction or instruction and is part of Jewish practice centered on moral and ethical disciplines. Participants will study text and engage in practices that focus on behaviors and character traits such as humility, anger, patience, gratitude, trust, compassion, speech, and judgment. These practices include *chevruta* study (in pairs both during the class time and outside class time), journaling, sharing our personal experiences, and identifying text as a group and individually that is used to help maintain focus.

An initial meeting for anyone interested in pursuing the program will be held on Thursday, February 11 at 7:30 pm at SJC. The SJC *Mussar* group will become one of many groups under the guidance of the *Mussar* Institute. The program runs for 13 sessions meeting every other week. At the February 11 meeting, we will determine when the group will start and when it will meet. Once the 13 week session begins, others will not be able to join. ## January Forum: Early Childhood Poverty, Health, and Education

Seaside's Community Service Committee is joining several other organizations to co- sponsor a Public Forum on Early Childhood Poverty, Health, and Education. The forum is being planned by the Coastal- Georgetown Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW). It will take place on January 21 from 9:30 a.m. to 12 noon at the Epworth United Methodist Church. Following the forum, participants are invited to stay for informal discussion. Bring a bag lunch; drinks will be available.

The AAUW set out three goals for this effort:

- (1) Increase sensitivity to local realities for many of our youngest disadvantaged citizens,
- (2) Identify specific challenges which need attention
- (3) Set priorities and initiate actions related to early childhood poverty, health, and education.

Other co-sponsoring organizations include: the Delaware AAUW, the Coalition for Tolerance and Justice, the Rehoboth Beach Lions Club, the Coalition for West Rehoboth, the Epworth United Methodist Church, and the Bethany Beach Disciples of Christ.

In 2009 the Coastal Georgetown Branch AAUW held a forum on Women in Prison which was co-sponsored by several organizations

and was very well attended. They hope is to increase the attendance by the general public who may not be aware of the extent of the problems of childhood poverty in Sussex County and to initiate some specific actions related to the problem.

## Tzedakah – An Important Jewish Mitzvah We need to hear from you!

In recent months we've been writing about the efforts of SJC in conjunction with the Progressive Interfaith Alliance (PIA) to do our part to alleviate extreme hunger and poverty. Some of you have been moved to participate in one of the programs we've recommended and others of you have indicated your involvement in other programs. This coming summer, the PIA will host a follow up to the program held in February 2009 at which time each of the participating faith communities will present on the work they've done toward alleviating poverty and hunger. The SJC program has been to engage as many of our members as possible in this fight.

We need to hear from you about what you've done so we can weave together all the components into one story. We want to hear from you if you've signed up with KIVA or FINCA or any of the micro finance organizations that help poor people get back to work during this year. We want to hear from you if you've donated your time to teach others how to find a job, write a resume, dress for success, or plant their own gardens during this year.
