## Religious School Happenings

Religious School starts on Sunday, September 12. Every month during the school year, the newsletter will provide information about what is happening at the school. This month, we want to the faculty to introduce themselves.

### Education Director - Allison Colker

## Jewish History Class Continues

## Have You Completed a Missed The Mark Card in Preparation for the High Holy Days?

In less than a week, we here in Rehoboth Beach, DE along with Jewish people all over the world, will be together for the holiest days on the Jewish calendar, the Yamim Noraim – the Days of Awe. These ten days are an incredible gift as we are given the opportunity to shake things off and turn around. The theme of teshuvah – turning/returning – is a thread that runs through the liturgy and Torah teachings for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach said it best in his song about returning –

Return again

Return again

Return to the land of your soul

Return to who you are

Return to what you are

Return to where you are

Born and reborn again

As each of us begins preparing for the upcoming Holy days, perhaps we can take a few moments to ask ourselves some questions and start the process of returning to who we are, returning to the land of our soul. What do we do, what actions do we take, what behaviors do we exhibit that we'd like to change? Can we identify areas of our lives where we've "missed the mark" and where we'd like to do better? While we may be thinking there are many such areas that we need to work on, perhaps there is one that needs more attention than another?

For the past few years, we've asked you to write down that one area where you feel you've "missed the mark" and that you'd like to change. Your "missed the mark" cards are then read as part of the Yom Kippur worship services. We will incorporate this practice into our worship again this year and ask that you come to Rosh Hashanah or Yom Kippur services with a 3x5 index card already completed with the area where you've missed the mark.

With the High Holy Days just around the corner, the time for asking ourselves these questions is upon us. Real change requires a process which begins with searching our souls for that one major area where we've missed the mark. Once we've searched and identified an area, we need to acknowledge that we've missed that mark and stop doing what we've been doing. Then we need to ask others we may have hurt to forgive us. Only then can we come to the Yom Kippur service to repent, ask God to forgive us for missing our mark, and turn.

## Global Day of Jewish Learning

On November 7, 2010, Jews all around the world will come together in their communities, homes, and online to celebrate our shared heritage through a Global Day of Jewish Learning. Together we will study, explore, and debate a single set of texts to discuss, question, and get a sense of being part of one people. This is the first worldwide, trans-denominational and non-denominational event devoted to Jewish learning and the ways in which it can bring us together.

Seaside will participate with the DE Jewish community at the statewide program which will be held at the Jewish Community Center in Wilmington.

Seven topics will be covered in the classes to be offered that day: Environment, God, Love, Leadership, Miracles, Prayer, and Tzedakah. All of these topics originate from tractate Ta'anit of the Talmud.

This effort belongs to all Jews, no matter how disconnected from or active in the Jewish community they may be. From the most secular "cultural" Jews to the most religiously observant Jews, all are welcome.

More than 150 communities around the world have already registered to convene Global Day of Jewish Learning programs on November 7, representing Jews throughout the United States, Canada, Israel, Europe, India, Australia, Turkey, South America, Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, Moldova, Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, and Kyrgyzstan. By November 7, more than 300 communities will

be registered to participate, along with 1,000 house parties worldwide.

The Global Day of Jewish Learning celebrates the completion of Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz's audacious quest to translate the Talmud from the original Aramaic and ancient Hebrew into Modern Hebrew began in 1965 when he was 27 years old. He will complete his 45-volume translation and commentary during a ceremony in Jerusalem on November 7, 2010. In addition to the full Modern Hebrew translation, he has translated parts of the Talmud into English, Spanish, French, and Russian.

The Global Day of Jewish Learning is a project of the Aleph Society in partnership with the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the Jewish Community Center Association, Jewish Education Service of North America, Jewish Federations of North America, Hillel: The Foundation for Jewish Campus Life, and the Shefa Institute. Supporting partners include the governing bodies, leadership, and ordaining institutions of the Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox movements of Judaism, as well as the leadership of the Reconstructionist Rabbinical Association.

Seaside is conducting Shabbat services at the SJC building on Friday, September 3 and 10, and on Saturday, September 25. Friday evening worship services begin at 7:30pm and Saturday morning services begin at 10:00am.
