### First Thursday: Jewish History

## Delmarva Jews Meet

On Sunday, December 19, approximately 110 people, representing Delmarva Jews from synagogues in Easton (B'nai Israel), Rehoboth (Seaside Jewish Community), Chestertown (Chestertown Havurah) and Ocean City (Temple Bat Yam), gathered at Temple Bat Yam to enjoy a group lunch and to hear a presentation about The Beatles and the Jewish connections to The Beatles. The lecturer was Joel Glazier, a noted Beatles historian and a retired educator from Wilmington, Delaware.

It was the first time that these Eastern Shore synagogues joined together to hold a joint event. Over 25 SJC members attended. Some Jews unaffiliated with any synagogue also attended. People came from as far away as Wilmington and Chestertown for the event. The event was free for all attendees. SJC members provided the lunch, with Temple Bat Yam supplying the room, paper goods, beverages, coffee and some dessert.

A wonderful time was had by all, and plans are being made at this time for another event, perhaps a night of Jewish comedy, sometime in the spring. It is hoped that the synagogues, as well as other Eastern Shore synagogues and unaffiliated Jews, can get together a few times each year for social and educational events.

## Community Services/Social Action Committee News

The Community Services/Social Action Committee meets on the third Friday of each month at 11 AM at SJC. To get involved, contact the chairs Cheryl Fruchtmann or Sylvia Diehl. Their contact information is on page 3. The committee sponsors many programs throughout the year. These programs are:

Charitable Contributions – Based on recommendations from the committee, SJC contributes money to several organizations that help others. In 2011, SJC sent money to Mazon – the Jewish response to hunger, La Esperanza – a Sussex County organization supporting the integration and empowerment of immigrants in our communities, and Jewish Federation to support

those affected by the devastating fires in Israel.

Blood Bank - SJC maintains a group membership with the Blood Bank of Delmarva. The Blood Bank offers a blood assurance plan that provides blood replacement coverage for its members while in Delaware. Most health insurance plans do not cover the charge for replacing blood. As a Blood Bank member through a group such as Seaside, the blood assurance plan would be available even if you needed it while outside of the state.

Food & Clothing Collection –SJC continues to collect gently used clothing, non-perishable food products, and toiletries which are then donated to a variety of organizations that provide these items to those in need. Bring items to SJC and leave them in the downstairs closet on the appropriately marked shelf at the base of the staircase.

Host Program – Several SJC members are spending time each week at H.O. Brittingham Elementary School in Milton mentoring students.

Mitzvah Day, Jewish Federation – SJC will participate again this year with a project close to our home.

The committee is hoping to support our armed forces personnel with a book collection and letter writing day. The program will be held this spring.

Road Clean Up – Twice each year SJC partners with Epworth United Methodist Church to clean Holland Glade Road and then get together for a pot luck dinner. The next road clean up will take place this spring.

## SJC Celebrates Chanukah

SJC celebrated Chanukah on Sunday, December 5, with a recital and songs presented by members of the religious school. ## SJC's Kashrut Policy

Every so often people ask about Seaside's policy related to food and we wanted to print it in the newsletter as a reminder. The policy was instituted in 2008 and is still our policy today. Questions related to the policy or to Kashrut should be directed to the Worship Committee.

Seaside events at which food is served should be designated as **either** a dairy or meat event – milk products and meat products should not be mixed at the same event. Meat does not have to be "kosher". In addition, foods served should not include non-kosher products such as pork or shellfish, and meat product should not contain any cheese or other dairy items. Food served during Passover should not contain any chametz. Kosher wine and kosher grape juice should be used for Kiddush. These guidelines apply to events held within the SJC building and at events where Seaside provides the food at other locations.

If you or anyone covered by your membership plan needed a blood transfusion, the Blood Bank would pay the cost of replacing it. Non-members are billed for any blood they use or must replace the blood used. Most health insurance plans do not cover the charge for replacing blood.
