### First Thursday: Jewish History

On **February 2**, the topic is "17th century Marranism (the secret practice of Judaism by the Marranos) and Messianism." This class will cover the Conversos reintegration into Jewish Communal life and the messianic movement of Shabbetai Zvevi, who despite his conversion to Islam still had followers who believed him to be the Messiah. We will discuss the connection between these two events, and whether there are any similar movements in the Jewish community today.

On **March 1**, our topic is "The Challenge of Baruch Spinoza." What was this challenge? What was its impact on the Amsterdam Jewish Community? What effect did it have on European Judaism then and now? After we view the DVD, SJC member Rabbi Dick White, who has studied the phenomenon of Spinoza, will explain and interpret Spinoza's philosophy for us.

All these classes will offer issues to provoke and cause interesting discussion. So come and be part of this traveling through Jewish history. This will enable him to prepare sufficient handouts.

### Second Thursdays: World Religions

On **February 9**, we continue our discussion on Judaism. We'll discuss how each denomination views God and the practice of Jewish law and ritual. Then, on **March 8**, we will begin our

discussion on Christianity with a guest speaker, Father Jeffrey Ross from St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Lewes. Please plan to come and learn. This class is facilitated by our Religious Leader Beth Cohen.

### Third Thursday: Moveable Feast

On **February 16**, Robert Stowe England, author of "Black Box Casino" and a senior writer for Mortgage Banking magazine, will present a program addressing "What's Happening Economically in the U.S." Have you wondered how the financial crisis that caused the mortgage meltdown was responsible for the massive economic destruction that many Americans are still struggling with today? Mr. England will provide some riveting data and analysis that adds to the collective understanding of the subprime crisis.

### Fourth Thursdays: Pirkei Avot

On **February 23**, we continue to explore the ethics of being Jewish as we discuss the verses of Pirkei Avot, the Ethics of the Fathers. This Talmudic tractate is a guide to behavior, attitudes, civility, honor, integrity, faith, and aspiration. You probably already know some of the verses in this book. One is, "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I, If not now, when?" In our discussion, we will try to relate these teachings to the way we live today. This is a self-directed class, like a book club, where each class member is both leader and participant. A group that will study and engage in the spiritual practices of Mussar is forming within the SJC community. Mussar is a Hebrew word which means correction or instruction and is part of Jewish practice centered on moral and ethical disciplines. Participants will study text and engage in practices that focus on behaviors and character traits such as humility, anger, patience, gratitude, trust, compassion, speech, and judgment. Specific practices could include chevruta study (in pairs outside class time), journaling, sharing personal experiences, and identifying text that is used to help maintain focus.
