Brain Longevity: Exciting New Series

Would you like to improve your overall life quality and well-being? A new Adult Education program will begin on Mar. 7 at SJC. Leslie Slan, SJC member and Alzheimer's Research and Prevention Foundation's (ARPF) certified Brain Longevity Specialist, and Cathy Brown, a certified yoga instructor and therapist, will present a five-part series on "The Four Pillars of Brain Longevity and Alzheimer's Prevention." The classes will be held on Thursday mornings: Mar. 7, 14, and 21 and April 4 and 11 from 9:30 to 11 a.m.

ARPF is dedicated to the prevention of Alzheimer's by funding integrative medicine research and providing educational outreach and memory screenings. They have published 30 research papers on lifestyle that can improve brain health even as we age.

The classes will focus on nutrition and supplements, stress management, physical and mental exercise, and spirituality. The series is a research-based program on yoga and integrative therapies for brain health and healthy aging. It will include practical everyday strategies, restorative and chair yoga, breath, and meditation as ways to keep your mind healthy.
