President's Message

My Mussar chavruta has just completed studying the soul trait of compassion. The wonderful result from studying a Mussar trait was that I began to look at how I express this trait in my life.

While in California recently, I saw a street woman sitting on the ground. What does Judaism have to say about how I should act? How should I express my *compassion*? Quoting *Everyday Holiness*, the book used in studying Mussar, compassion is more fundamental than a feeling; it is also an action.

As I sat and talked with this woman, I understood that she was an American refugee, living in the country where she was born, but now without a home. Hers was a sad story, eliciting compassion from me. Judaism says, “You shall love the stranger, because you have been strangers in the land of Egypt.” Our teachings directed my actions.

The festival of Purim offers us a chance to express several Mussar traits. We can feel *joy* when the name of Esther is read at the Megillah reading, and we can express the trait of *responsibility* by adding money to the tzedakah box that will be available at the Megillah reading at the Lewes library (see story on page 1). You will be helping the needy. You will be expressing your compassion for others in need.

Message from Reb Lisa

Cuba is a complicated place. We heard that repeatedly on our recent humanitarian mission. Although it was my sixth such adventure, it proved to be every bit as rewarding and meaningful as the previous ones. Once again, I witnessed a deep sense of love, family, and appreciation for life which words cannot adequately convey. With limited resources, few material possessions, and a very small protected view of the world, the Jewish community members of Cuba lack for nothing when it comes to the awareness of the blessings of their life.

Seaside should be extremely proud that our humanitarian gifts assisted the communities greatly, and yet we were told over and over that our visits are the gift they treasured. I'm certain that the Jewish people are well and thriving in Cuba, despite the difficult conditions the country faces and the lack of everyday basic needs like food, medicine, and sundries. They are happy and content with their lot and grateful for our presence, and they know they have not been forgotten!

Seaside's mission provided crucial gifts and resources to seven Jewish communities in Cuba, much greater in proportion to our size than most of the other groups who visit. Thanks to everyone who contributed and joined us. *Am Yisrael chai* and *Viva Cuba!*
